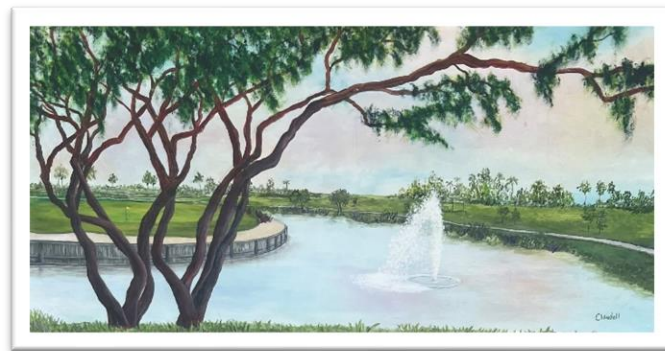
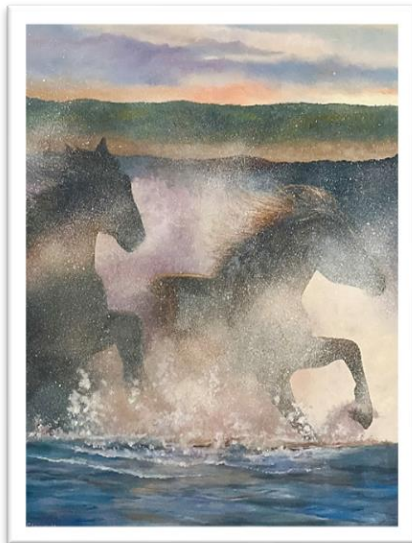

Born into a family of artists, I have dedicated my life to painting and drawing, specializing in large-scale oil works. Since High School I majored in art and mechanical drawing. This was followed by a technical education in art and architectural design, in which I made history as the first female graduate of the Hudson Valley Technical Institute in Troy, N.Y. I then went on to a long, distinguished career as an architect for New York State, creating “as built drawings” of historical preservation structures in homes, civil engineering landmarks, and forts throughout New York State.

A few hours here. A morning there. Something tried, something continued. Not everything needs to turn into a finished piece or a clear outcome.

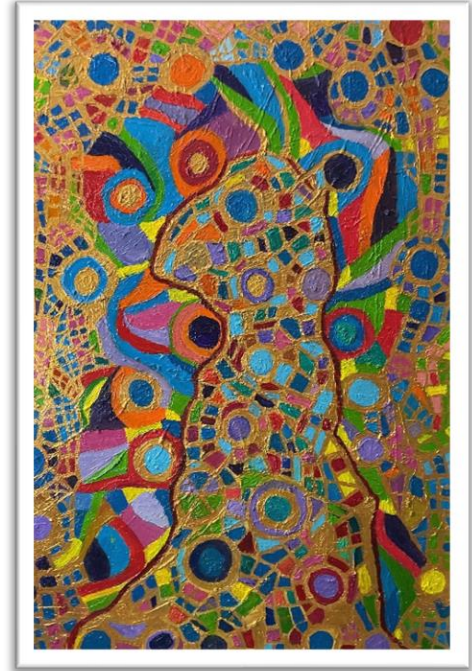
Possibility doesn't always look like a wide-open calendar. Sometimes it looks like noticing when a little bit of time appears... and stepping into it. Even if just for a while.
