
# This Month's Program

This month's spotlight shines on Vivian Knoll Chaska.




In the Entertainment Department



# **Artist**



Lynne Stavedahl and her husband moved to The Villages in July, 2004 from Minnesota. Lynne's career was split between working at the corporate office of Target Stores in merchandising and the corporate office of Ameriprise Financial in communications.

She always had a desire to become a potter, but her work schedule and class offerings in Twin Cities area did not make that possible. After moving to The Villages she visited the Clayer's Club at Mulberry Recreation Center to inquire about membership. All pottery clubs in TV require prior experience or a beginner's class at the Lifelong Learning College. She signed-up at the LLLC and was introduced to making "art out of mud." Most of the class sessions were focused on hand building with a

short time on the wheel. The wheel was what she wanted so she set out to find a studio that offered semi-private classes. After traveling an hour each way for a series of classes, she decided it was time to focus on her own technique for throwing. As in other media, different artists use a slightly different technique. She purchased a couple DVD's and used youtube.com for her education. It wasn't long before she purchased a wheel to have in her garage so she could practice whenever the mood struck – and didn't have to clean up the mess every time!

Lynne's focus is mostly on functional pottery – using glazes and trimming techniques to make them more attractive than your store bought item. She has also made several garden totem poles that you may have seen in various yards around TV.

Lynne also belong to the Villages Woodworker's Club and enjoys turning on the lathe and making small furniture items for their home.

She has participated in many of the VAA art shows that show 3-D and has volunteered at the shows that don't. She also audited the club's treasury register for the past 3 years.

Aside from pottery, Lynne enjoys playing bridge, pickleball, golf, traveling and spending time with family both here and when she and her husband travel back to Minnesota – however, they are full-time residents – as is their darling dog Jazzy!

Maureen Therrien, award-winning master of the digital arts, is this month's Photo Frame focus.




I caught the photography bug in 2005 but didn't actually start creating 'photo art' until moving to The Villages and joining the Photo Club and the VAA in 2010.

# Tips 'n Hacks

### Tips for Selling Art - by Maria Downton

The following tips are to aid in selling at art shows. There are certainly other venues like galleries and online websites, but these are not the focus of this article. To successfully sell your art consider the following.

### Let your customers get to know you

Talk about your work and yourself. Educate them about the process. Show them your passion for your work. Remember not to go overboard! It should be a conversation where you talk and then you listen. By getting to know you and your work, the customers become closer to a piece. This can result in an art piece meaning more to them.

### **Know your customers**

Find out what customers like about your work. Engage them in conversation to explore what they are looking for – is the piece for a certain room, do they like certain colors. This may lead you to determine that they like fall colors, they like landscapes, or they like abstract art. Treat both new customers and repeat customers in the same polite and professional manner.

### Have business cards and/or a website (or Facebook page)

Business cards will allow customers to contact you regarding future work or commissioned work. Make sure the card reflects your art and is professional looking. This will jog their memory once they take the card home.

A website (or Facebook page) would allow people to see your latest work. You can advertise about up and coming shows. A website would also allow customers to look at your work for possible commissioned work. Make sure the photos of your work are professional looking. This will also be useful if you sell note cards or prints.

#### Setup to sell

When setting up your booth or table, ensure that the items are at least hip high. If customers have to look down to the ground, then they might miss a good painting or piece. Elevate your work by adding risers to the table legs or by adding riser boxes or stands on top of the table. Arrange pieces so they catch the eyes of the passersby. You can arrange items by categories or like items (e.g. group pieces by smalls, mediums and large items).

### Diversify your selling items

Along with paintings or artwork add note cards, prints, framed and unframed paintings/prints or other representations of your art. You might consider using different surfaces for your artwork (e.g. paint on metal, Plexiglas or Masonite board). Also consider varying sizes. All of these measures will attract customers who are looking to spend a little to those looking to spend a lot. There are several options, but don't overwhelm your table. This will make it difficult for customers to make up their minds. Keep it simple with some diversity. You may need to experiment to find out what items your customers like.

### Set your prices based on the market and piece

Your pricing should reflect your item. A framed painting is going to have a higher price than a print. Find out what your local market will bear. Be sure to sell at the same price across all selling venues.

These measures can help in making a sale and building your customer base. Before your next art show, start planning for success. Happy Creating!
