I took my first oil painting classes when I was a bride at Yokota AF Base in Japan in 1969. But unfortunately when my two sons were young my paint box mostly stayed in the closet. And I realize now that was a big mistake!

In my mature years, creating art became a way for me to heal and connect with people. Face painting children at the Boulder Farmers' Market every Saturday for ten years in Colorado soothed my heart following divorce. The children smiled at me as I tickled them with my paintbrushes so I created a character called "Smiley Tickles" which led to more colorful Rainbow tale critters, and storytelling. But that's a story for another day!



New vistas opened in 2001 at a "plein air" workshop with Don Ward in Taos, New Mexico. I felt old and awkward as I struggled to set-up the French easel and my first plein air attempt appeared childlike. Though my heart was singing because I was

anxious to begin to create my own, original art, outdoors in nature; the Japanese instruction had been about copying. Painting outside, on location was reverie and I enjoyed chatting with people who stopped to watch me paint.

In 2005 I moved to The Villages to be near my mother. I



### Banner Artist Reveal



This month's banner art features **Phyllis Speicher**, who orchestrates brush and glaze to produce exceptionally beautiful works.

I have been painting porcelain for over 20 years. Of all the art mediums, I prefer porcelain art. I enjoyed taking lessons from several local teachers when living in Indiana and furthered my studies at the Indiana, Illinois, Georgia, and Florida Porcelain Art Schools.


I have studied under National teachers such as Brenda Morgan Moore, Barbara Bougher, Nancy Fisher, Margaret Fowler, Paula White, and Andrew Orr as well as International teachers such as Rosa (Venezuela), Felipe'

from (Portugal) and Harem Ashcrafti (Switzerland). I am a member of Florida World Organization of China Painters, VAL, VAA and LAA.

Porcelain art is an ancient art developed in China. The paint is in powder form then mixed in mineral oil. After painting the piece then the piece is fired. When painting, it has the feel of



oil paints, must be smoothed like watercolor and after firing has the look of watercolor. The piece is fired 3-5 times between 1300 - 1450



The paintings are mostly china painted on porcelain tiles just like an oil painter painting on canvas or a watercolorist on paper. The difference is that the tiles must be fired in a kiln instead of air drying like oil paintings. I also paint in watercolor. It resembles watercolor in many ways. The painting of the lake and pine trees is watercolor. The rest are china painted on porcelain tile, which can be framed, and look like watercolor.


















Phil's career in art can be traced to his early childhood when he had a natural love of nature and an admiration for those who were able to express themselves with drawings or other forms of art. Following four years of art education, Phil was honored

as "most artistic" in his Dunkirk, NY high school senior class. The early years of adult life were

consumed with the challenges of raising a family, but he enrolled in oil painting classes in 1973 where he studied under an accomplished local artist for five years.



It was in 1983 that he stumbled into the world of woodcarving. Having been presented with a broken down old decoy, he made the needed repairs and proceeded to paint the Mallard Drake. Armed with a hammer, chisel and some left over wood from a remodeling project, Phil then created his first mallard wood carving starting from scratch. He proceeded to enroll in carving classes for two years under a master woodcarver. He has since created hundreds of carvings and paintings that he sells in art exhibitions throughout Western New York and more

recently, in Florida. He is the recipient of many ribbons and awards.

Phil first came to The Villages in 1999, and in 2008 purchased his first home here. He promptly joined VAL and VAA, and continues to participate in major exhibitions along with Art in the Park displays. Phil often says, "The Villages is a great place to be an artist."





### Old Florida in Black and White Dave Boege



Dave Boege has been involved with photography in one way or another since junior high school. He learned through self-study, seminars, and classes. During his corporate business career in Chicago, he walked to the Art Institute of Chicago on some lunch breaks to see the photography gallery and saw original prints by Ansel Adams, Edward Weston and Henri Cartier-Bresson. Those exhibits helped foster his deep interest and passion for the design elements and emotion of black and white photography.

Dave moved to the Village of St. Charles in The Villages in 2010. He made contacts at the Polo Club, and in 2011 became the official club photographer and held that position for eight years.

During the past several years as a member of VAA, he has photographed the artwork and exhibitors at the VAA art shows for their web site gallery. "The VAA artists," Dave says, "have been a source of further inspiration to me as an artist."

In April 2019, Dave attended an exhibit of Clyde Butcher photographs at the Appleton Museum of Art in Ocala. Clyde Butcher is a master landscape photographer and has been called the "Ansel Adams of the Everglades." His black and white prints inspired Dave to begin his own project photographing rural Florida in black & white. He travels around central Florida looking for abandoned houses, barns, churches and other structures and rural scenes. Capturing these images in classic black & white preserves the timeless quality of Old Florida.

Although Dave continues to photograph various equestrian events, the Rural Florida project is now Dave's primary means of artistic expression as a photographer. To see photographs from his Rural
