




The President's Message

Program at March Membership Meeting




Brian Dickson:

Brian is a retired Art teacher and School Principal (June 2006) with teaching experience on 4 continents and 8 different countries. Brian runs the Wednesday morning (9 -11:30) 'Art in Paradise - Studio Opportunity' at Paradise Recreation Center and is a founder-member of the Gem and Mineral Society of the Villages, a member of the VAA and the VAL. He has been an International Baccalaureate Art Examiner and teacher for many years. He is on the committee of the Art Scholarship awards of the VAA.

Brian has been in the Village of Silver Lake full time for 11 years and spends much of his time making Sterling Silver Jewelry, incorporating his Lapidary skills whenever he can.

<u>Brian's March 5th presentation</u> concerns a very important part of artwork production - how to transfer your source piece to the final original accurately. He will demonstrate the use of the adjustable PANTAGRAPH and the "Squaring-up" method. He will also talk about his "reverse perspective" pieces and pass on the 'secrets' of producing them!

Today many artists use photos as their primary source material for their inspiration. There are ethical and copyright limitations if the 'original' is the work of another person and the final product is to be an exact copy. If on the other hand an artist wishes to use his/her own photograph or preliminary sketch and needs to enlarge it, there are various methods to achieve this and Brian will be dealing with two of them - Squaring-up and the Artist's Pantagraph. As a short addendum he will go over the processes involved in the production of his 'Reverse perspective' pieces.






Meet Kathy Karol

ARE YOU IN AN ART SLUMP?

As an artist, you probably know how wonderful it is to get a rush of unexpected inspiration when you can't wait to get started on a new painting. Unfortunately, that doesn't happen every day. If you waited around for the right mood to strike each time you wanted to paint, you might wait for a very long time. During these trying times, we can get depressed or discouraged. This month, I've done some research and discovered some exciting ways to inspire your artistic abilities.

- First, let's look at your painting space? Is it set up and ready to go? Is there a piece of fresh paper sitting there, with fresh water and paint? Hang up some paintings on the wall, either your own or paintings of artists that inspire you. Can you play music in your art space? If not, buy a "Google Home" or "Alexa Echo" and ask it to play some inspirational music you can paint by. Did you know the color blue inspires creativity? Paint your room blue!
- How are your supplies? Maybe you should buy a newer or better camera. A new brush or tube of paint or even an easel can start those creative juices flowing.
- What time are you most creative? Is it morning or after lunch? Is it early evening or after dinner? Try painting at different times and decide which time is best for you. Schedule yourself to spend 30 minutes every day to paint. If you don't get motivated in 30 minutes, stop. If you do, keep going!
- Have an old painting you have been avoiding? Is it too all-encompassing? Try painting a little each day, maybe the sky one day and a tree the next. Break it up into smaller projects. Then when you finish that painting, you'll get a dopamine rush. Your self-confidence goes up, and the next piece of art you attempt is a lot easier! But vice versa happens too: If you don't finish your work, it chips away at your self-confidence and can lead to a huge negative spiral.
- Change your attitude. Try to fall in love with the actual process of producing art instead of just the end result.
- Learn to play with your art. Try new colors and techniques. Humans are wired to learn from play.
- Go outside and take a walk with your camera. Photograph a bird or a tree. Maybe a flower in your yard. Photograph something ugly and make it beautiful with your art!
- Go through your old photos with a viewfinder. Try cropping a photo and only paint a small section of a scene or an object. While you're at it, put some inspirational photos in a folder and label it "To Do."
- Buy some notebooks, put one in your purse, one in the bathroom, and one in your bedroom. When you think of a good idea for your art, jot it down!





- Friends can be a great source of encouragement. Find a friend that might appreciate reciprocal accountability, who will ask you how far you have gotten on a project. Someone with who you can trade critiques. Someone who will encourage you.
- Watch Youtube.com and learn some new techniques or subjects.
- Go to an art gallery or show. There are plenty of shows in and around The Villages. See what fellow artists are painting or selling.
- Take a class. There are many free classes here in The Villages at recreation centers, and some you may have to pay for but are well worth the money. You may even meet another artist to share ideas or paint with!
- Go to art club meetings and talk to other artists. Ask them about their work and what inspires them. Their ideas and enthusiasm could inspire you!
- Look on the web and find art contests. You may not win first prize, but it will get you to push yourself a little.
- There are many art websites to see other artists' works that might inspire you. Some of my favorite sites are Fineartamerica.com and Artpal.com. These are also good sources to see what is currently selling.
- Get out your old artbooks, or buy new ones written by your favorite artist! Many times, they have illustrated step-by-step demos you can follow.
- Hang up one of you favorite art motivation poster, or paint one! Here are some examples.

The VAA hopes the efforts of these dedicated art professionals and their students will result in some excellent applications and art from the class of 2021. March 6th is our deadline for all Scholarship Forms and CDs to be sent in.

<u>Final call</u>if any VAA member knows of a local or regional senior art student who might be homeschooled or tutored during these Covid times, please let us know. We will connect and get an on-line application out to them.

Challenges have continued in raising funds to support our cause. However, over the past month we have received <u>two substantial gifts from the families of recently deceased artists</u>.

One of those donations came from a most successful local art sale. It was held by Judy Oathout, so the proceeds from her husband Ed's supplies & equipment could benefit our 2021 scholarship winners. Thank you Judy, for your generosity, and the hard work in organizing the sale to help our students.

Our second major gift was from the family of a former student of mine who became a children's book illustrator and eventually a lead project artist for the Gov. in Washington DC. She was a multi-Scholarship winner during HS and at art colleges, earning three degrees. A brilliant talent was cut short by cancer last fall at age 39. Her family wished to remember her with an art scholarship for a young female graduate in FL.

Anyone can still contribute to our 2021 outreach, with a check made out to the VAA Scholarship Fund. All donations go directly to support students, and are tax deductible.
