
With the cancellation of our October show and Nan's Celebration on Creativity, I know we are a bit more that discouraged. But this too shall pass. Hopefully.

Spotlight on You



Dore Via Dumas was born in Richmond, Virginia and has moved over 48 times. She is number two of four girls, the daughter of an Air Force Lt. Colonel and a mother who studied at the Memphis Art Academy. Throughout her travels she learned to appreciate many kinds of art. In high school, she failed art because she didn't want to make her pictures "exactly" like the teacher's. With much help from her mother, she found her own voice. After trying a variety of media, she took a

pottery class and discovered her true calling. She could be dirty and not get in trouble and she could make all the things she had been making out of mud as a child.



As a single mother of two children, Dore traveled around Florida, Kansas, and Alabama selling in art shows and selling to shops and galleries and wholesale in the Merchandise Mart in Dallas, winning numerous awards for her work. She also taught pottery to children. Years later, she attended the University of South Alabama and received her B.S. in Special Education and a Master's of Information and Library Science at the





University of Southern Mississippi. Throughout her teaching career she continued to make her pottery and was a Master Potter at Dollywood in Sevierville, Tennessee.



Another medium that interested her was mosaics. As a teenager, she lived in Italy where she visited Spilembergo Mosaic School and fell in love with the color and texture of the glass. Later in life she decided to learn about mosaics. She is a self-taught mosaic artist.

After retiring from teaching, Dore moved to The Villages and joined the Mulberry Clayers and Sculptors

and the Small Wonders Miniature Club. She incorporates pottery with miniatures and creates tiny worlds. She also belongs to the VAL, VAA, Tennessee club and the Belle Aire Society.







In July, 2016, Dore went to Certaldo, Italy, for ten days to study animal sculpture. On returning, she shared her knowledge and experiences with the Mulberry Clayers and Sculpture Club.

Selling Your Artwork

The Villages is a great community for artists; not only does it have a wealth of classes to better our skills, but it is a great place to sell our artwork. Some of you are not interested in selling, but I've tried to list some tips to help you begin selling or sell more for those of you who are. I have geared this article towards painting, but it can apply to artists using other mediums.

Most importantly, know who your customer is, whether you are selling in The Villages or outside. Permanent residents buy to decorate their homes, whereas seasonal residents or visitors probably purchase art to take home with them or buy as gifts. Most will buy art that inspires meaning or a feeling or rekindling a memory from their past.

What painting subjects will sell the most?

"Art Business Today" has published data on what paintings sell best. I've listed them here in order of sales amount.

- Traditional landscapes
- Local views
- Modern or semi-abstract landscapes
- Abstracts
- Dogs
- Figure studies (excluding nudes)
- Seascapes, harbors, and beach scenes
- Wildlife
- Impressionistic landscapes
- Nudes (Not allowed in The Villages)

Christie's and Sotheby's both agree that red is the most desirable and sought-after color, followed by white, blue, yellow, green, and black. They believe blue will be the next hot color. Here is a list of painting mediums in order of sales. (I think this is based on where you are selling and

the type of customer)

- Limited-edition offset-litho prints
- Limited-edition giclée prints
- Open-edition offset-litho prints
- Original Oil and acrylic paintings





- Original Watercolors
 - Artists' original prints (e.g., etchings and engravings)
 - Open-edition giclée prints

Give the artwork a title!

Take some time to decide on a good title. Sometimes a good title can help sell your art! Reflect on your feelings when you created the art and think about what you want to share with your audience. How does the painting make you feel? Maybe even name it after the center of interest! Johannes Vermeer's "Girl with a Pearl Earring" draws the viewers' attention right to the earring. Sometimes a title can tell the audience what to look at in a painting, as in Georgia O'Keeffe's painting, "Calla Lily Turned Away."

Suppose you have a painting of a dog on the beach. If you named it "Best Friend," it would have one meaning. If you named it "Abandoned," it would create a whole other meaning for some people. Brainstorm ideas and write them down. Ask friends and family for ideas. Look for inspiration in poems or Quotes or translate a title into another language.

Originals or Prints?

Decide if you want to sell just originals, prints or both. I mat all my art, add backboard and put them in clear plastic bags. Acid free is the best, as to not ruin your paintings over time. Check the show's rules for labels. The VAA wants you to use specific labels for your price tag and title. Make sure the price stands out, and label your work "print" or "original".

Decide how you are going to make prints. If you are going to print them yourself you will need a large format printer, preferably Epson. If using Epson paper with Epson ink the prints are considered archival, meaning they will last over 100 years. Tell this to your customers. You will also need a good camera that will take high quality, high density photos. The more pixels, the larger you can print. In addition, you'll need software to crop your photos to size before printing. If you decide to have someone else make your prints, you will need to bring your original paintings to the printer or take your own photos, crop them the right size and bring them to a printing store on a SD card or thumb drive.

What size painting should I sell?

That all depends on the customer. Smaller size paintings usually sell for less, and therefore sell more often. Depending on the customer, if they are buying something to hang on the wall, they probably would prefer a larger painting, so I would sell both. Keep the price of the larger paintings within reason.





What Price?

Pricing is one of the most frequent questions we have when selling our art. Consider what it cost you to create the art. You want to stay profitable. Other things to consider are your audience and what they can afford or are willing to spend. Also consider your level of experience, the quality of your art, what your competitors charge and your past sales prices.

Setting Up

Go to a show first! Look at how other artists set up and show their art. Some artists have elaborate easels and display boards, and some use tables and small easels. Talk to the artists to get ideas, and check out their prices. Some type of table cloth is usually a must. This keeps everything neat, and you can store things under the table, out of sight. Put your best paintings forward to draw customers over!

Stay Organized

Keep a log of the art you sell along with the price you sold it for. This will help you the next show. Business cards are essential in case a buyer wants to contact you or view your website. Print a painting on a small card with your information on the back, and hand them out. Everyone likes freebies. They will find you next show!

Day of Show

Greet your customers when they come to your table, but try not to be overbearing. Some customers just like to browse on their own. If a person is particularly interested in a specific piece, explain or tell a story about the work. It gives the art meaning. Be flexible with payment methods. You should be able to take credit cards. Have different size bags for buyers, or you may want to order some. You can even offer shipping.

When you paint, you usually have one of three things in mind. You want to paint something to sell, you want to enter it in competition, or you just want to paint something that inspires you, something you love. I believe you should put your heart into art and paint what you love. If you sell it, excellent! That will help deter the cost of supplies so you can paint more!
